Part Two: The Story Of God's Family

Most families have photograph albums which show some stories of the family. God's family has existed for thousands of years, and the story of God's family is told in the Bible. The most important parts of the story are about Jesus, in the New Testament.

Either:

Find lots and lots of New Testament bible story books to read (from home or Sunday School or church or your RE teacher)

Or:

Read some parts of Luke's Gospel in the New Testament. You don't have to read it all - ask your teacher or priest or parent to mark the stories which are best for you.

Make a little picture book as you read. Cut 2 sheets of paper into 4 pieces each and staple them together like a little book. Write a title on the front "Stories about Jesus", and on the other pages, draw a picture about each story you read and write a title. Do 2 stories on each page.

When you have done lots of reading and drawing, watch a video about Jesus from your teacher or priest.

Part Six: Holy Communion

You share many meals with your earthly family at home, and the Holy Communion is a very special meal we share as God's family.

More than 1,000 years before Jesus was born, God's special people the Jews were slaves in Egypt. On the night God set the people free, he told them to sprinkle the blood of a lamb on their door so the death plague would pass over them. He also told them to have a meal of flat bread and roasted lamb, and to call this meal the Passover.

With an adult, cook some flat bread to eat like this:

Mix half a cup of flour with a big spoon of oil, a little spoon of salt and some water.

Knead it into a circle.

Cook it both sides in a frypan with a little oil.

Eat it while it's still warm – yummy.

On the night before Jesus died on the cross, he and his disciples were having a Passover meal.

Find out what Jesus did during that meal by reading Mark 14 verses 22 – 25.

This is the meal we call Holy Communion.

Christians share it every Sunday because Jesus told us to.
