# What can you do?

Dear Friends,

As a Diocese we are collectively making a very real difference in the lives of some Newton College students and to ongoing Anglican Ministry in PNG. Earlier this year we sent \$7,340, raised in last year's appeal.

As Bishop Driver reported in Newton News April 2202 *"Students have repeatedly expressed their appreciation for the financial support that they have received from... Australia. The \$1000 pledged has paid half of their student fees and provided a small monthly allowance of 150 kina to families (\$60) and 100 kina (\$45) to single students. This amount might seem small, but it is often all they receive. The Anglican Church of PNG, as well as individual dioceses, continue to struggle financially. At present, no diocese is financially supporting students."*

There are about 90 people in the college community and they provide most of their own food through gardens which they cultivate, on the college grounds. The allowance from the scholarships allows them to buy items like rice and soap. Please continue praying for these students and their families as they face challenges of health, food and clothing.

I commend this appeal to you. Please forward your donations to our Diocesan office so a secure transfer can be made. Our contributions will make the future of Anglican Ministry in PNG a brighter, more secure prospect.
